 - The PSSA is an important tool that provides critical information about the academic progress of your student(s). Individual student scores help teachers identify a child's strengths and areas for growth, which in turn allows teachers to personalize a child's instruction to best support their growth. PSSA scores also provide information to schools and the District to support improvement and planning around curriculum and instruction.

 The PSSA is state mandated, and participation by all students in grades 3-8 is required by federal law. Therefore, it is very important for students to attend school daily and remain enrolled in school during the testing window.
